I. Introduction.

C. Christians were called believers (known for their faith), those who call upon His name (known for their prayer life), those who walk in Him (known for having their lives summed up in the life of Christ) - if we could be like this it would have a major impact on the world. (Colossians 3)

D. In Jesus Christ all the fullness of deity dwells, so if He dwells in you then all you need dwells in you.

II. Commitment.

C. If every Christian submitted himself humbly to the Lord and the Word, a whole nation could be evangelized.

E. The committed life begins with a life given to the will of God contra the world. (1 John 2:15-17)

F. Three reasons for committing one's life.

1. Your life is a vapor. Life is far too short to be little - let God make it big. (James 4:14)

2. Only the souls of men and the Word of God will last, so commit yourself to them. (2 Peter 3:10)

3. Your work in the Lord is not in vain. No one was ever bored in the book of Acts. (1 Corinthians 15:58)

G. Jesus Christ was demanding - He asked for everything. (Luke 5)
