The Gospel of Christ John MacArthur

I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Romans 1:16-17.
- B. Romans is an expansion of what we see in these two verses.
- C. We are often ashamed of the gospel of Christ. Christ would not accept the person who simply came to him for comfort. (Matthew 7)
- D. Paul was not ashamed of the gospel because it is powerful.
 - 1. It is a stumbling block. (1 Corinthians 1)
 - 2. Yet it is powerful. (Romans 9)
- E. Understanding the gospel of Christ is understanding four key words.

II. Power.

- A. The gospel carries with it the power of the omnipotent God.
- B. Men are impotent to change themselves. (Jeremiah 15:23, Matthew 22:29)
- C. The gospel has the power to change men. (Romans 5:6; 8:3; James 1:18; 1 Peter 1)
- D. The gospel is foolishness to Gentiles but power to the Christian. (1 Corinthians 1:18, Matthew 28:18)

III. Salvation.

- A. Salvation means deliverance.
- B. Salvation is from sin, lost-ness and judgment. (Acts 2:40)

IV. Believing.

- A. Believing is faith. Where there is faith there is the power of God.
- B. God asks men to believe. Behavior comes later.

V. Righteousness.

- A. The reason the gospel can save is because God's righteousness can become yours.
- B. The righteousness of God is manifest through faith in Christ. (Romans 3:21, Philippians 3:9)
