	Introduction

- A. Text: Romans 8:35.
- B. God's love is a love from which we cannot be separated. (Jeremiah 31:3, II Timothy 1:12)
- II. The truth of eternal security is that God keeps the believer.
 - A. The reason all things work for eternal good is that God called us.
 - B. God's power keeps us from all enemies. We are under God's protection. (I John 4:4, Psalm 91, Numbers 14:9, Deuteronomy 33:29, Joshua 10:42)
- III. If we understand the cross, we can understand what God will do to save us. (Romans 5:8, Psalm 32, Philippians 4:19, II Corinthians 9:8-7, Isaiah 50:8-9, Hebrews 9:7)
- IV. To deny the security of the believer is to deny the sufficiency of the work of Christ. (Hebrews 6:17)
- V. Nothing separates the believer from the love of Christ, not even persecution. (II Corinthians 11, 3:12)
 - A. Persecution merely shows who has salvation and who does not. (I John 2:19)
 - B. True believers are willing to take up the cross—they hold fast to the end. (Luke 9:57, John 8:31-32)
 - C. Believers are super-conquerors in trial because they come out better than they were before when all is said and done and there will be greater reward.
 - D. No circumstance in the universe can cause God to let go. There is security in the arms of the Savior.
- VI. Paul has a confident assurance that no created thing or anything that life throws at a person could separate him from Christ's love. (Galatians 1, Ephesians 6, John 17:23)
