- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: Romans 13:8-10.
 - B. Enthusiasm is easier than obedience. (Romans 7:14)
 - C. Obedience is still essential to the life of the believer. There is no power, blessing or joy without obedience.
 - D. The true test of a Christian is his obedience. (Psalm 119, I Peter 1:2, Philippians 2:12, Romans 16:19, 7:22)
 - E. Obedience means to keep God's Word.
 - F. Obedience is sometimes restrained by our flesh.
- II. Salvation affects our relationship to society. The key way it affects us is through love.
 - A. All of obedience is reduced to love.
 - B. When one lends money to someone in need, the Lord will pay him back. (Psalm 37:26, Proverbs 19:7, 17, Matthew 5:42, Luke 6:35)
 - C. The only debt that a person constantly should owe is to love one another. (Matthew 25:27, Psalm 37:21, Matthew 5:44, Romans 12:14, 12:20, Galatians 6, Colossians 3:14, I Corinthians 14:1, Philippians 1:9, I Timothy 2.15, II Peter 1.22)
 - D. Love is...
 - 1. Teaching others the Word of God. (II Corinthians 6, Ephesians 4)
 - 2. Ministering to the needs of others. It leads others to the Lord. (Hebrews 6:10)
 - 3. What covers the sins of others. (I Peter 4, I Corinthians 13, Ephesians 4:15, John 15:12-15)
 - E. We can love because we have a new capacity from the Holy Spirit. (Romans 5:5)
- III. Appropriating love...
 - A. We must comprehend what is available. (Ephesians 3:15)

- B. We must submit to the Holy Spirit. (I Thessalonians 4, Ephesians 5:22)
- C. We must purify our hearts. (I Peter 1:22)
- D. We must realize the urgency of love. (I Peter 4:7)
- E. We must choose to love. (Colossians 3:14)
- F. We must be with believers and not isolate ourselves. (Hebrews 10:24)
- G. We must concentrate on others. (Philippians 2)
- H. We must consider the results.
