- E. Sin is a transgression of law (that of the Ten Commandments but also the law of conscience) or a missing of the mark.
- F. The result of sin is present hell and future judgment because we were made for God. Without God there is an emptiness.

G. Our needs are the same universally - we need God.

E. Christ has given the speaker a security that he would not change for the world.

A. We desperately need a spiritual shoulder to cry on because of our condition.

B. Instead of being tied to a right wing government, Christianity should be addressing the evils of government.

C. A Christian is a person that is to live Christ under any form of government. He is to live Christ under any system so far as he can.

D. God's love for us is deeper for us than anything we know. When Christ comes into our hearts, this deep God love is shed abroad in a deeper way than we have known.

E. The movement today that has given impetus to social work around the world has been the Judeo-Christian religion.
