- B. For Jesus the will of God was to please the Father.


II. God's will.

- A. The will of God simplifies life.
- B. The will of God is perfect and acceptable. (Romans 12:22, Deuteronomy 5:29, Isaiah 48:17-18)
- C. God has promised to guide us. (Psalm 32:8-9)
- D. We are to understand what the will of God is. It is possible to do this. (Ephesians 5:17)
- E. Often times the will of God leads us into a different kind of trouble.
- F. We must know the will of God in times of trouble.

III. Parts of God's will.

- A. That which applies to everyone.
 - 1. The commandments.
 - 2. Giving thanks.
 - 3. Doing everything without grumbling.
- B. That which applies to a person God's particular will. (1 Samuel 3:8)
- IV. Arriving at the will of God.
 - A. Heart preparation.
 - 1. This requires confessing sin. (Psalm 68:16)
 - a. You begin with the "inlook," not the outlook.
 - b. This is tuning into the will of God.

- 2. Obedience towards the already known will of God. (Jonah)
- 3. Surrender.
 - a. One must surrender to the will of God whatever it is before we know it. (John 7:17)
 - b. This is because God is a Person who loves us and wants us to be in relationship with Him. He wants to be trusted. (Psalm 56:13)
 - c. We have to surrender people, prejudice, pride and our own will.



B. Prayer.

- 1. Pray in faith. (James 1:5)
- 2. Watch for the answer. (Psalm 5:3)
 - a. Through the Word of God. God can speak through the general tone of the Scripture.
 - b. Through providential circumstances.
 - c. Through reason. God enlightens the understanding. (Psalm 32)
