 - B. God made us to be fulfilled this way.

 - 2. Noah walked with God, and He blessed him. (Genesis 9:1)
 - 3. Abraham walked with God and was blessed by God. (Genesis 17:1-3)
 - D. Facts about fellowship.
 - 1. God is a Person.. God is not just an energy He is a Person we can have fellowship.
 - 2. God is accessible. We can have fellowship with Him because of this.
 - 3. God has reconciled us to Himself.
 - a. Sin has separated us from God.
 - b. We can walk with God in Christ only because God has reconciled us to Himself.
 - c. These are simple facts regardless of belief
 - E. Conditions for fellowship.
 - 1. Repentance and confession.

- a. This means a change of mind.
- b. It is impossible to have fellowship with God without this.
- c. Christians and non-Christians all have need for repentance. (Revelation 2:5)
- d. Confession means to agree with God about sin. (1 John 1:9)

2. Faith.

- a. This is faith in God's Word. (Colossians 2:6-7)
- b. We received Christ and walk by faith in God's promises and Word. This is the reason for Scripture memory.

3. Obedience.

- a. This involves listening and responding.
- b. We listen to what God says about all things through the Word and responding to that.
