2. It will determine our character. The basic problem is not ignorance, but rebellion. (Romans 1:21-25)

 - A. God's revelation comes from the Bible and Jesus Christ.
 - B. Essentials for having a proper concept of God.
 - 1. A pure heart. (Matthew 5:8)
 - a. Our concept of God determines our character.
 - b. Our character determines our concept of God.
 - c. Do you try to have a clear conscience before God and man. (1 John 1:9)
 - 2. We have to search the Scriptures. (Proverbs 2:1-5)

a. God is omniscient. (Psalm 139)

b. There is a difference between memorizing an outline and getting into the Scriptures yourself.

3. We have to seek Jesus. Jesus is God on earth living in the circumstances that we have to. (John 14:9)

4. We have to be obedient. (John 14:21)

a. Surrender comes before knowing God's will.

b. God is holy, and God is love. He wants us to be holy and love because He is holy and loved. We should reflect it ourselves. (1 John 4:7, John 14:21)

c. God is not our servant - we are here to do His will.

d. The big problem is pride. The solution is surrender.
