

Pursuit of Holiness – Part 2

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I. Introduction.

A. God has made provision for our holiness. (2 Peter 1:3)

B. Text: Romans 6.

II. What God has done.

A. We are united with Jesus in his death in order that we might walk in holiness. (John 15)

B. God has made possible a life of holiness through our death to sin.

1. Dying to sin means being removed from the kingdom of sin and Satan to the kingdom of grace and God's Son. (Romans 5:21; Acts 26:18; Colossians 1:13)

2. The Son of God voluntarily identified with our sin so that we could be free from its kingdom's hold. (Colossians 2:14)

3. What happened to Jesus happened to us. We were crucified with him, and we died to the kingdom of sin. (Acts 26:18; Colossians 1:13)

C. We have a new citizenship because of the death of Christ. It is not possible to live in the old place. (Romans 6:1)

D. Our change of status makes a change in behavior possible. (Romans 6:6; 1 Corinthians 1:27)

1. We are to offer ourselves to God instead of as instruments of sin because of our status.

2. We must count on that we have been delivered from the dominion of sin.

3. We must count on that we are alive to God and have access to his influences.

III. What God is doing.

A. God has sent his own Spirit to live in us.

1. The Spirit teaches us truth. (2 Corinthians 3:18)

2. The Spirit gives us the right desires and renews our will.

B. God uses certain means such as...

1. Providential circumstances. (Romans 8:28-29)

2. Pastors and teachers for growth.

3. Scripture itself. (2 Peter 1:4)
4. Prayer. (Hebrews 4:16-17)
5. Discipline. (Hebrews 12:10)
