

Goals and Objectives

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I. Introduction.

II. Our first part of the objective is to preach Christ warning men of judgement.

1. Christ is in you and doing a good work in you. (Colossians 1:28)
2. Christ is to be preached in all the world. (Mark 16:16)
3. We need to get in our minds an idea of the need of the world.
 - a. A world vision is not gotten by traveling.
 - b. A world vision is gotten through prayer and the Bible.
 - c. To have a true world vision Christians need to quit fighting amongst themselves and participate with each other.

III. The second part of the objective is teaching every man.

1. This is the key to accomplishing evangelism. God intended that the world would be evangelized by thousands of Christians not few
2. God's supreme purpose in saving sinners is for God's glory. (Isaiah 43:7)
 - a. Creation was created for God's glory but it was lost because of sin.
 - b. As a result a recreation is needed.
 - c. We build the lives of men and women so God can be glorified. (Ephesians 1:3-14)
3. How we glorify God.
 - a. By accomplishing God's work.
 - b. By bearing fruit. (John 15:8)
 - c. By prayer.
 - d. By giving all we have of ourselves.
 - e. By being like Him.
4. In order to get disciples to glorify God we are going to have to feed them or follow them up.
 - a. This is being a shepherd or coworker with God.

b. We are to feed, protect and train disciples. They need “parental care.” (1 Corinthians 4:15-17)

c. This means to get the disciple into the Word.

d. This also means to get him into Christian fellowship.

e. It must be personal. A vision can only be passed on heart to heart and on one’s knees before the Lord.

f. It must be individual at both the beginning of a person’s conversation and afterward continually.

g. The disciples must be equipped for the work of the ministry of edifying and building up the body of Christ. (Ephesians 4)

1) Equipping others to do the work of the ministry spreads around the work.

2) This is spiritual multiplication. (2 Timothy 2:2)

h. The reproducer focuses in on a few. (Matthew 26:39)

IV. The responsibilities of an area representative.

1. The primary objective is to build a few men and women, not the multitudes. (Luke 14:25-26)

a. This is to take place wherever they can be found and to be focused on ages 19-30 because they are more impressionable.

b. The representative is to recruit men. There are no limitations to this.

c. The Navigators should have a unique task in the body otherwise they should have no reason for existing.

2. A representative represents the Navigators as a whole—he is to relate the work to the entire whole and promote the entire work. Everyone is together in the work.

3. A representative is a representative of the training that occurs at Navigator headquarters.

a. Every staff should be in training continually.

b. Area men should be getting further training so that he can do a bigger job in the future.

c. The hope is that these men would recruit people ultimately to go over seas.
