XIX. God wants us in fellowship with him. (1 Corinthians 1:9)

XX. We capture a longing for a close relationship with God by walking away. We'll want to get back in naturally.

- XXI. God is able to give you a way out of sin.
- XXII. The need of the hour is more men to help.
- XXIII. Keep reviewing Scripture memory the harder it gets. (Isaiah 58)
- XXIV. Anything we have from God is strictly by God's grace. The disciplines are not for finding God's favor. The disciplines are a means of focusing on God and allowing him to do a work.
- XXV. Help a man become thanksgiving by praying with him. (Romans 8:28)
- XXVI. Maintain accountable with people who live far away by checking in every once in a while.
- XXVII. Keep on keeping on no matter what the church decides to do.
- XXVIII. God wants you to know his will, so be neutral and ask for him to reveal it to you.
- XXIX. It is good to keep the wife at home, but each case needs to be handled individually.
- XXX. Keep teenagers motivated spiritually by being patient.
- XXXI. Bitterness is too expensive. (Hebrews 12:15)
- XXXII. The basis for divorce and remarriage: adultery and unconverted spouse who leave.
- XXXIII. Encourage your wife in staying home and taking care of the children even if they want to be out meeting with women.

- XXXV. A divorce does not make you a spiritual leper. There is still much you can do.
