(1) Freedom of the life in Christ (8:1-11)

3. Importance of this freedom (8:5-9)

(c) From the law of death (8:10-11)

(2) Obligations of the life in Christ (8:12-30)

(a) Stated negatively - no debt to the flesh (8:12-17)

(b) Stated positively - Christians should gladly

share Christ's sufferings that they may share

His glory (8:18-30)

1. Because anticipated glory far exceeds

present sufferings (8:18-25)

- 2. Because the Holy Spirit assists believers now (8:26-27)
- 3. Because all things (even sufferings) work together for good to believers (8:28-30)

(3) Permanence of the life in Christ (8:31-39) - guaranteed

by the relationship of those in Christ to

(a) God the Father (8:31-33)

(b) Jesus Christ (8:34)

(c) All possible trials, enemies, or states of being

(8:35-39)

Applications - Specifically, for purposes of the intended emphasis of this lesson, the Holy Spirit:

- 1. Produces in the Christian a victory over sin not available by law-keeping (8:2-9).
- 2. Will actively participate in the physical resurrection of the Christian's body (8:10-11).
- 3. Assures Christians of our position as sons (and heirs) of a loving Father (8:14-17).
- 4. Is the "firstfruit" of God's promises to us (8:23-25).
- 5. Intercedes for us in prayer (8:26-27).
