II. The Word of salvation. (Revelation 3:20)

B. Because of this, at the end of life there will be a beginning. What will count is whether one's name is written in heaven. It is because He said so.

III. The Word that one's labor is not in vain in the Lord. (1 Corinthians 15:58)

A. Little is much when God is in it.

B. We are to invest in whatever God gives us.

IV. The Word that God will freely give us all things. (Romans 8:32)

A. If God met our need through His Son, why would He withhold anything else?

B. Our problems are not too great for God, even in our senior years.

V. The Word that God will pour his blessing on our descendents. (Isaiah 44:3)

A. We have a right to have God protect our children while we serve Him. (Acts 2)

B. We can pray over the wayward child that God would pursue him.

C. The desolate ones will have more children than those that had. (Isaiah 54:1)

D. There is a work in the ministry today because people believed God.

VI. Just because one grows old does not mean that God's promises will change.

A. You take care of the depth of your life and God will take care of the breath of your ministry.

B. Presently the speaker is continuing his international ministry by discipling business men.

C. God buries His workers and carries on their work. Abraham and David are examples of this (Genesis 15)

D. Every Word of God proves true—He will honor faith.

VII. While the outward man is perishing, the inward man is growing day by day.

A. We want our lives to have been "last seen going up."
