I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Psalm 104.
- B. God accepts us as we are and then sets to work to make us as we are.
- C. The psalmist describes both the works of God and the ways of God.

II. There are four testimonies in which God delivers from trouble.

- A. The restless ones.
 - 1. People are designed for cities because its where there is excitement and security.
 - 2. God delivers people by leading them on the straightway.
 - 3. God satisfies the thirsty and leads men to contentment.
- B. Those that are held as prisoners by thoughts, ideas and attitudes.
 - 1. They rebelled against God.
 - 2. They spurned the counsel of men.
 - 3. As a result, they found themselves bound by hard labor.
 - 4. When they cried to God, they found the power to act.
- C. Those that were sick—the neurotics—either literally sick or emotionally sick.
 - 1. This is often an issue of wickedness.
 - 2. God sent His Word and healed them.
 - 3. This means He identified with them. God became flesh and dwelled among them.
 - 4. Sacrifice always speaks of joyful service and this is how we express gratitude for God setting us free.
- D. Those engaged in the normal practices of life when an overwhelming crisis arises.
 - 1. God deliberately sends disaster and trouble to us because it gets our attention.
 - 2. God knows that the most important thing to you is to hear His Word.
 - 3. He turns it into prosperity, and then He uses prosperity.
