## The Mind of Christ Ray Stedman

- I. Introduction.
  - A. Text: I Corinthians 2:14-16.
  - B. Christianity centers on Christ.
  - C. The central question of the Bible is what a person's relationship with Jesus is.
- II. Man was intended to operate from his spirit open to the revelation of God directly.
  - A. Today man operates on the level of the soul, which reflects his ability to choose.
  - B. The worldly man only operates in the natural world—he sees nothing beyond this life worth considering.
  - C. What limits the natural mind.
    - 1. He is shut off from the things that concern God—he does not understand the things of life such as marriage and sexuality.
    - 2. The natural man is unable to understand the things of God.
      - a. This is because these things are spiritually discerned—a man needs the Spirit of God to understand them.
      - b. The world can be helped through the message of Jesus.
      - c. The presence of the Spirit of God in a person's life separates the true Christian from the false one.
      - d. It is possible to have the Spirit and not obey it as a carnal Christian.
  - D. It is the Christian's responsibility to call out the ethical realities of life.
    - 1. Many are not capable of doing this however because they are not living ethically nor do they know their Bibles.
  - E. There are times when a Christian is above the law.
  - F. The believer has the mind of Christ.
    - 1. He will behave as Jesus did.
    - 2. He will be compassionate, kind, frank, etc.
