III. Love for all of the saints.

- A. God has joined faith in Christ and love for God's people.
- B. If we are going to be guided in the will of God, we must love all of God's people.
- C. Christian love is an act of the will.

IV. A deepening knowledge of God.

- A. The most important thing in life is to get to know God better.
- B. If we are growing in our knowledge of God, it will be much easier to know his will better.
